POST-GRADUATE RESEARCH GRANT 2008 Conditions of Grant & Agreement

1. The aims and methods of the proposed research must not conflict with the aims and philosophy of the Foundation for Rabbit-Free Australia.
2. No part of a grant may be claimed to pay salaries or overheads of a host institution. The grant may only be used to defray costs directly associated with the purpose for which the grant was awarded.
3. A grant may be deferred by up to one year. This may assist students entering graduate courses in a mid-year intake, or students who must defer a course for one year.
4. Grantees must provide two copies of a written report (and audiovisual or digital material, if relevant) to RFA within fourteen months of the date of receipt of the Grant, unless an extension is approved. This report should include:
 - (i) a short summary of the results of the research project in a form suitable for publication in the RFA newsletter, *Anti-Rabbit Roundup*
 - (ii) a financial accounting of how the grant was spent, and
 - (iii) a statement of anticipated publications arising from this support.

This report may also be placed on the RFA website.

5. Grantees must acknowledge the support provided by the Foundation for Rabbit-free Australia with any resulting published or promotional material.
6. Upon completion of the project, grantees must consult with the Foundation about the ultimate disposition of any equipment purchased using funds from the Research Grant.
7. Applicants must obtain all necessary permits (eg. from Ethics Committees and government authorities) to carry out the research project. Grants will be conditional on all necessary permits being obtained before the research begins.

If awarded a RFA Postgraduate Research Grant, I agree to abide by the conditions set out above.
